In Kenyan culture the burials are an extremely important moment to show your support. Family, friends, and colleagues will travel to the burial no matter how far away it might be. If you are not able to attend yourself, it is important to send someone in your place. This shows your solidarity.

Before I could finish getting out my words of apology, my colleague interrupted me saying, "No, you sent your associate chaplain and we received him. It is well."

This connectedness and care for others is what the apostle Paul is displaying. Paul passionately communicates the kingdom values of sacrifice, concern, and care because his heart is hidden in Christ.
