Praise is more than upbeat songs and happy faces. It is heart, mind, and will all in harmony with grace. We need to reexamine our spiritual priorities. We "love God and trust others." That makes sense except that love of God needs to be a verb, an act rather than just a warm feeling. All too often people tend to disappoint and betray our trust.
