We don't know what time of year it was when the angel Gabriel visited Mary in Nazareth. The "sixth month" in Luke 1:26, refers to the term of Mary's relative Elizabeth's pregnancy. It was probably just an ordinary day in a non-descript town that had become a byword for "nowheresville" (see John 1:46). Luke even felt the need to explain to his readers that Nazareth was "a town in Galilee."
