King David would probably have agreed with the sentiment on the shirt. You would think a king who had forged a single nation out of disparate tribes, defeated their enemies, and brought economic prosperity would have earned some peace in the sunset of his years, but no. The later part of his life was marked with tragedy, scandals, and outright rebellion led from within his own family.

David hadn’t forgotten the lessons learned in his youth. The Lord was his rock of refuge. Since he was a youth fighting off the predators that attacked his father’s flocks, David had learned to rely on God. “Do not cast me away when I am old; do not forsake me when my strength is gone,” he prayed (v. 9).
