1 Samuel 25:20-31

In 1 Samuel 25, we discovered that David, a God-chosen man, reacted to Nabalâ??s refusal to provide food for his 600 men with anger. This was not the response of a king and leader who had been chosen by God to lead his people. It is often easier for us to react to situations rather to respond in a godly manner. We can feel justified even to the point of â??spiritualizingâ?• our reactions.

Abigail came to David in humility and, in verse $28\underline{a}$, reminded him that he was Godâ??s chosen king and that â??the Lord will certainly make a lasting dynasty for my master.â?• She also urged that â??no wrongdoing will be found in you as long as you liveâ?• (v. 28b).

Often, you and I are guilty of reacting to situations, perhaps by taking things into our own hands and seeking revenge or an are children of the King and should respond in a manner that is in keeping with our being made in his image.
