Isaiah 41:1-10

For some, home is so far away—in miles and in the distance between aching hearts

Surely, some of the Jewish pilgrims whom Isaiah was urging homeward felt that way. They had been away for some six decades. They complained that Yahweh had abandoned them. They doubted that God had the power or desire to bring them home again.

But the prophet proclaimed that Yahweh was sending Cyrus the Persian to conquer Babylon and set the Jews free. And it happened.

Yet, 500 miles of deserts and desperadoes lay between them and Jerusalem. Yahweh promised, “Do not fear, for I am with you; . . . for I am your God” (Isa. 41:10a).
