1 John 5:1-12

At the time it seemed that Christian values were too binding. Many young people had cast off biblical commands regarding sexual purity and respect for authority. The prevailing belief seemed to be that freedom meant absence of restraint.

However, the ensuing decades have shown the fallacy of this belief, as our society deals with divorce, disease, and other consequences of sin. As is often true in God's kingdom, we find here a paradox: True freedom is not the absence of restraint but the safety of obedience to God's commands.

One of the blessings of growing older can be gaining peace of mind. With age comes contentment, clear priorities, and most important, a lifetime of answered prayers and forgiven sins.
