Ephesians 1:1-10

Ephesians 1:3-14 is a hymn-like expression of prayer and praise to God for His blessings. The object of praise is the Triune God (1:3). Its occasion is the celebration of a??redemptiona?• (1:7, 14) by its grateful recipientsa??a??usa?• and a??our.a?• The words a??before the creation of the worlda?• (1:4) remind us that redemption was no afterthought. The plan was a??predestineda?• (1:5, 11).

Biblical predestination is not about Godâ??s arbitrary choice of some people to be saved and others to be lost. It is, instead, a reminder of Godâ??s gracious plan to unify â??all things . . . under Christâ?• (1:10). Through the death of His beloved Son, God would adopt believers as His children through â??the forgiveness of sinsâ?• (1:7). He would send â??the promised Holy Spiritâ?• (1:13) to make us â??holy and blameless in his sightâ?• (1:4).

But the ultimate purpose of Godâ??s plan was to create a people who lived to â??the praise of his gloryâ?• (1:12, 14; see 1:6). God was not seeking redeemed people to flatter His fragile ego. Our redeemed lives may be a spontaneous expression of gratitude to God.
