Amos 9:1-15

Good Friday, 1964, an earthquake struck North America near Seward, Alaska. Forty railroad tankers had just been loaded with aviation fuel. Before the shaking stopped, the city's generator ignited the railroad cars. Thirteen of Seward's citizens perished. Railroad and highway bridges to Anchorage were destroyed. The residents of Seward were cut off from the outside world.

In the months after the quake, discouraged people departed on the marine highway. Many thought Seward, Alaska, would not survive. It had no working infrastructure. The railroad docks were gone. The fishing fleet was destroyed. It was devastation.
