The Lord calls His chosen people â??obstinateâ?• and â??stubborn.â?• Also, the message Ezekiel is called to deliver is composed of â??words of lament and mourning and woe.â?• God commands the prophet to eat the scroll on which these words were written. Perhaps surprisingly, the scroll tasted â??sweet as honeyâ?• in Ezekielâ??s mouth.

In Psalm 19, King David uses five different words to describe Godâ??s communication with His people: law, statutes, precepts, commands and decrees. â??They are more precious than gold, than much pure gold; they are sweeter than honey, than honey from the honeycomb. By them your servant is warned; in keeping them there is great rewardâ?• (Psalm 19:10-11). Even Godâ??s words of warning are sweet to those who will heed them.

Ezekiel had to take Godâ??s Word into himself. It had to become part of his being. Until the message we proclaim has become part of us, we cannot fully impart it to others.
