

Hard Head, Soft Heart

Ezekiel 3:4-15

In some ways it is harder to be a faithful witness to family and neighbors than to people we do not know. God did not minimize Ezekiel's challenge. The prophet was called to speak words of judgment to people who had become "hardened and obstinate" (v. 7).

Jesus said of Nazareth, His hometown, "A prophet is not without honor except in his own town, among his relatives and in his own home" (Mark 6:4). He "was amazed at their lack of faith" and "could not do any miracles there, except lay his hands on a few sick people and heal them" (vv. 5-6). Luke (4:29) tells us that the Nazarenes were so furious with Jesus that they tried to throw Him off a cliff!

God promises to make Ezekiel "as unyielding and hardened" as his hearers (Ezekiel 3:8). Tough times demand tough prophets. God's message must be proclaimed, whether they would listen or not.

"Forgive us for thinking that others have soft heads and hard hearts, when we are often the ones afflicted by both. Help us to be more open with our hearts, more knowledgeable with our heads, and more generous in spirit." (Moravian Lectionary).
