Gospel music devotees have heard many artists perform Crouch's songs—musicians like Elvis Presley, The Imperials, The Winans, and many others have offered their versions of his contributions. Local church musicians often lead worshipers into a spirited singing of "My Tribute."

However, few of the people who embrace his music realize that Andraé Crouch is dyslexic—words and sentences did not come easily to him. In order to write his songs and express his feelings, Crouch drew pictures to express the meaning of the words. From the rich imagery of his vivid pictures, deeply meaningful songs were born.
