Isaiah 42:1-9

Isaiah 42:1 seems almost naïve. Isaiah's message from God predicts the Savior will bring justice. "Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will bring justice to the nations" (Isa. 42:1).
