Isaiah 52:13—53:5

The God of heaven became a man. C. S. Lewis suggests that it is something like a person becoming a slug. Nevertheless, it boggles the mind to think that this perfect God-man, the King of Heaven, came not as a king to be served but to wash the feet of people. “Whoever wants to be first must be your slave—just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many” (Matthew 20:28).
