Job 2:1-13

Satan, the "adversary," was in heaven. God said, "Where have you come from?" and Satan answered, "From roaming throughout the earth" (Job 1:7), as if they were just passing the time of day. Then God said, "Have you considered my servant Job?" (v. 8). It would be nice to think that God has a high opinion of you, that there was no one on earth like you, but surely the Lord knew He was drawing a target on Job.
