Galatians 5:13-26

It's all part of the grumbling, arguing, second-guessing society we live in. When something displeases people, they get verbal and voice their displeasure. We are "crooked and depraved", the author of the letter to the Philippians puts it.

Rather, be glad to be who you were created to be. Verbalize instead that all you have is from God's hand and accept it as the gift it was meant to be.
