Esther 3:1-9

Hamanâ??s hasty promotion in the Xerxesâ?? kingdom was not without concern for the Jews living in Persia. Hamanâ??s hateful disposition toward Jews was seated deep in a national memory spanning hundreds of years. It stemmed from a time when God commanded King Saul to totally destroy the Amalekites, including their king, Agag, from whom Haman was descended (1 Samuel 15:3; Esther 3:1).

â??All the royal officials at the kingâ??s gate knelt down and paid honor to Haman. . . . But Mordecai would not kneel down or pay him honorâ?•(Esther 3:2). Mordecai had raised his young cousin Hadassah, who was now Queen Esther. Mordecai felt he had more to consider than Estherâ??s welfare. He had lived long enough to know that political power in the hands of someone filled with hate for Godâ??s people could have disastrous effects if unopposed. While everyone else knelt down and honored Haman, Mordecai refused.
