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Deuteronomy 6:1-9

When they get old enough they can decide for themselves.â?• Such thinking ignores the fact that we teach children as much, perhaps even more, by the things we donâ??t make a priority as by those we do. The â??commands, decrees and lawsâ?• mentioned in Deuteronomy 6:1 were not simply helpful guides to holy livingâ??which they were. In observing them, the Israelites embodied their call to be the people of God.

The core of Israelite belief was faith in â??the LORD (Yahweh) our Godâ?• and in God alone. It was their duty to â??impressâ?• this truth on their children. The word translated â??impressâ?• or â??teach diligentlyâ?• is a metaphor drawn from sharpening a point, such as on a sword or some other weapon or tool. Literally, when it came to passing their faith on to their children, the Israelites were to â??make a point of it.â?•

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
