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2 Samuel 12:1-18

When confronted with his sin, David made no excuses. He repented, asking God to create a pure heart in him. Even so, he pleaded with God for his son's life. After his son's death, he accepted the judgment of God. He then continued his life and was called a man after God's own heart.

The wages of the righteous is life, but the earnings of the wicked are sin and death (Proverbs 10:16). Do the sinful prosper? We observe that some do, at least in material goods and influence.
