Romans 5:12-21

Imagine what it would be like if we did not have easy access to water for bathing and washing clothes. These conditions exist in many world areas that experience a serious lack of water. Droughts force people, usually women and children, to walk for many kilometers to acquire potable water. Soaking in hot water is an unknown luxury. In Niger, a proverb meaning “I love you” is literally translated, “I accept your smell.”

King David modelled a contrite heart, writing: “Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow” (Psalm 51:7). What cleans us? The blood of the Lamb.
