Perhaps no one illustrates this better than Job. In a very short period of time Job loses his wealth and all of his children die tragically on the same day. It is safe to say that life was not going how he had imagined.

Job shocks us all, however, when he proclaims, a?? Naked I came from my mothera??s womb, and naked I will depart. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praiseda?• (v. 21). Things did not get better for Job after he said this. They got worse. But he repeatedly declares the goodness and righteousness of God throughout his life.

Godâ??s plans always differ from ours, but Godâ??s plans are always goodâ??even when they do not appear good. May we have the attitude of Job when life does not go the way we planned.
