Consequences are difficult to accept, especially for a child. Recently, my son struggled with a choice between two consequences. He was having a rough morning, but we had promised to go to the water park that day. We told him that he could either make better choices and have a short time-out at the pool, or he could continue to make poor choices, stay home, and miss the water park entirely. In his mind, neither choice was satisfactory. He wanted to have zero consequences for his behavior.
