He likens some evangelistic approaches to swinging a sledgehammer at the un-saved, trying to slam them into submission with a few tough-love truths and some guotable scripture.

Remember, however, the gospel means good news. Good news for this life and the next. God sent His Son out of love. That's good news. He didn't come to condemn us, but to save us. That's good news. He came for a transforming relationship with us now, in this world. That's good news. Everlasting life is The Foundry the hopeful plan for everyone. That's good news.
