Matthew 18:10-20

Saul, despite his faults, is still Godâ??s chosen, His anointed king. It will someday be Davidâ??s crown, but only in Godâ??s own time: not now and not this way! To do something for a good reason like cutting a piece of the kingâ??s clothes to make a point was deemed an unacceptable embarrassment and diminishing of this king, and Davidâ??s conscience soon rebuked him for it.

Bending to peer pressures, seeking to end personal troubles, or trying to commandeer Godâ??s plans must not cause us to do what we know is wrong.
