Mark 14:53-59

I love a blazing fire on a wintry day. Hlt's hard to leave all that and go back out into the cold, isn't it?

Mark 14 finds Peter nestled up to a fire on a cold night. Simultaneously, Jesus was enduring the worst humanity could dole out: mockery, torture, lies. All were ravenous to silence Him forever. All the while Peter was warming himself near the safety, and distance, of a soothing fire.

These days, it feels like culture is doling out its own share of venom against the Church. It's nothing new, really. Yet it feels like a spirit of anti-Christ is at an all-time high.
