2 Chronicles 20:18-26

The Lordâ??s victory over invaders coming against Judah, in 2 Chronicles 20, is sometimes mislabeled â??The Power of Praise.â?• As if the people of Judah by the power of their praise, led by a choir of Levitical singers, defeated the mighty coalition invading their land.

Judahâ??s worship was, instead, a <u>response</u> to the message of hope inspired by the â??Spirit of the Lordâ?• (20:14). â??For the battle is not yours, but Godâ??sâ?• (20:15). Without the Spiritâ??s inspiration and the assurance of Godâ??s word they would have been whistling in the graveyard, trying to get up courage to face their foe. It was â??the Lordâ?• who â??set ambushesâ?• against the invaders. The Lord caused fear and confusion, turning Judahâ??s enemies against one another. When the men of Judah arrived â??they saw only dead bodies lying on the ground; no one had escapedâ?• (20:24).

Unless grounded in Spirit-inspired hope and Godâ??s Word, our praise, to quote Paul, is only â??a resounding gong or a clanging cymbalâ?• (1 Corinthians 13:1).
