Description

Ezekiel 34:7-16

Nobody is perfect. We strive for perfection; after all, it is God's standard. However, we're all human. Not the least of these are our pastors and church staff. In the church, people may from time-to-time become disappointed by their leadership. Sometimes they're justified. Other times, not so much. Either way, God understands. Rather than simply complaining about it, He stepped up taking on the role of shepherd.
