Psalm 25:16-22

Davidâ??s heart would resonate with the psalmist of Psalm 119, who testified that â??in the night,â?• the remembrance of Godâ??s name (v. 55) and Godâ??s word gave him hope (v. 49). â??Arrogantâ?• people mocked him â??unmercifullyâ?• (v. 51) because of his adherence to Godâ??s law (vv. 51, 52, 54, 55, 56).

It is as if the arrogant were saying, \hat{a} ? You may turn Godâ??s decrees into song, but <u>we</u> have no use for Godâ??s lawâ?• (vv. 53-54, authorâ??s paraphrase). \hat{a} ? We will do as we please! \hat{a} ?•

â??Not so!â?• declares psalmist Asaph. Those who speak â??with maliceâ?• (73:8) against God and His servants, God places them on â??slippery ground.â?• He casts them down â??to ruinâ?• (v. 18).

The arrogant live with the short view; the psalmist lives with the long view, based on his knowledge of the past. He remembers Godâ??s â??ancient lawsâ?• (119:52), including Godâ??s acts of kindness to his ancestors. The remembrance of theseâ??â??your word to your servantâ?• (v. 49)â??enables him to endure othersâ?? present rejection.

In Godâ??s word, the psalmist finds comfort for the present (vv. 50, 52), hope for the future (v. 49), and a song wherever he finds a nightâ??s lodging (v. 54).
