Colossians 3:12-17

What a person wears can say a lot about him or her. Imagine a surgeon. She is wearing medical scrubs as she prepares for surgery. Now imagine this same surgeon at her daughter's choir concert. Now she is wearing "civilian" clothing appropriate for the location and occasion.

Many vocations have clothing associated with them in order to keep the person safe, keep the person comfortable while performing the job, and identify what the job is.

We are called by God to "clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience" (Colossians 3:12).
