Psalm 7:6-11

In Psalm 7, the psalmist asks us to consider Godâ??s anger and wrath. Those are aspects of Godâ??s personality with which we may not be entirely comfortable. There have been battles over whether to change song lyrics about â??the wrath of Godâ?• to speak of â??the love of Godâ?• instead.

When considering Godâ??s anger and wrath, it is important to remember that God is different from us. He is wholly other than we are. We are finite beings trying to understand an infinite, transcendent being, so our understanding always falls short. The problem comes in theology. We can be sure that we are no longer worshiping the God revealed in Scripture but are instead worshiping an idol of our own design.

Godâ??s anger and wrath are not expressed as if God sometimes loses His temper. Rather, Godâ??s anger and wrath are aspects of Godâ??s holy nature. At the heart of Godâ??s character is holy love. When Godâ??s anger and wrath are poured out, it is against evil and sin that justice may prevail.
