I question if I really do know them. Sometimes, the spark that brings the identity to my mind is a quality or characteristic unique to that person.

In the passage for today, the writer uses the word â??loveâ?• 15 times. Thatâ??s a lot of love in 10 verses! While it might feel like your mind could get tripped up on the word (it feels a bit like a tongue twister), loveis a vital part of this passage, and of God.

Our ability to love is wrapped up with so much. Those who love are \hat{a} ??born of God \hat{a} ?• and know God (v. 7). The opposite is also true: if you do not love, you do not know God (v. 8). The writer does not mince words: You either love and therefore know God, or you do not love and you do not know God. Why? \hat{a} ??God is love \hat{a} ?• (v. 8).

You cannot claim a relationship with God if you are not reflecting God: Love.
