Galatians 6:1-10

The word translated â??allâ?• is the Greek word <u>pas</u> and occurs more than a thousand times in the New Testament. It can be translated â??all, everything, everyone, whole, or always.â?• There is no getting around it: We are to do *good* to *all* people.

â??Allâ?• can be a wonderful thing: lâ??ve paid <u>all</u> the bills and have money left over. lâ??ve completed <u>all</u> my goals. lâ??ve finished <u>all</u> the laundry. â??Allâ?• can be a lot, too. lâ??m carrying <u>all</u> my familyâ??s burdens right now. lâ??ve used <u>all</u> my resources and still havenâ??t solved the problem. lâ??ve got <u>all</u> my chores to finish in one day. â??Allâ?• can be overwhelming, scary, or just plain hard.

Now imagine what God means by doing good to all people. Has God left anyone out of that description of a??alla?•? I dona??t think so. In fact, it is terribly interesting that there is a hint that this a??alla?• especially includes other Christians (sometimes we may feel that they are the hardest to do good to).

This week, ask God to show you just who the a??alla?• is in your life, and do good.
