1 Peter 3:15-22

If you could have lunch with someone from the past, who would it be? This is a question that really makes me think. Usually, biblical figures like Moses and Paul come to mind, as well as historical figures like Abraham Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt. Needless to say, although it is interesting to ponder, it is ultimately fruitless because they are no longer living and unable to speak to us.

The people Peter was writing to would experience suffering in the form of slander. Peter told the people not to fear, but instead to center their attention on Christ (vv. 14-15).
