

Seek Wisdom

Description

James 1:1-8

The focus of James 1 is, â??If any of you lacks wisdomâ?• (v. 5). Only the arrogant of heart would deny this lack. The rest of us (hopefully) recognize that we cannotâ??dare notâ??rely on our human wisdom to get us through the â??trialsâ?• and temptations that Satan throws at us daily. Thus, we need Godâ??s wisdom. So, James advises, â??Continually ask from God, who gives freelyâ?• (v. 5, authorâ??s translation). â??This prayer is not to be a one-time request, but a daily petition.â?•*

Godâ??s wisdom gives us guidance when our â??faithâ?• is tested, which enables us to persevere until life itself for each of us is ended and we appear before the Father â??mature and completeâ?• (v. 4).

James adds a condition when asking God for wisdom: â??When you ask, you must believe and not doubtâ?• (v. 6). We must believe (or â??trustâ?•) that God will, in fact, respond to our requests. If we do not believe we will receive wisdom, we will not â??receive anything from the Lordâ?• (v.7).
