Matthew 24:1-8.

Rachelâ??s daughter was born early. Barely over six pounds, with a head full of dark hair, this perfect little beauty stole her husbandâ??s heart at first sight. Her birth mother had been in and out of the hospital several times before Hattie arrived, experiencing contractions for weeks leading up to the day of birth.
