Deuteronomy 26:11-15.

If we look hard enough, we can inevitably see the grace of God in our lives. No matter your circumstances, Godâ??s grace has gone before each of us, drawing us to God, calling us to Him. Some of us might be able to see the brilliance of Godâ??s grace like the light of midday, shining over all our lives.
