Description

Romans 12:1-8.

Several years ago, there was a death in my family. Our family was gathered together a few days before the funeral. At one point, there was a knock on the door. A husband and wife from one of the church's Sunday School classes was at the door with a plate of food. They came in, placed the food on the table, and sat down on the couch. They said very little, and after about 15-20 minutes, they left.

Doesn't really sound like much, but that moment is etched in my mind. Why? I really don't know what gifts and abilities they did or didn't have, but I knew they were being the hands and feet of Christ.
