Yet, in Psalm 34, he testifies, â??This poor man called, and the LORD heard him; he saved him out of all his troublesâ?• (v. 6).

God was Davidâ??s ultimate refuge. There was not a place where God would not hear his call.

David invites us to â??taste and see that the LORD is goodâ?• (v. 8). Experience Godâ??s protection and care. No matter what troubles come â??those who seek the LORD lack no good thingâ?• (v. 10).
